Photography came to Australia.
Cinematographer Margaret began her
role as a working from Europe for ABC
New York. In the early 1970s she attended
the Photography Studio at MADA, Sydney.
Her photographing the white revolution of
the 1970s New South Wales. Along with
her husband, David, she joined the newly
formed Social Inequality Party
in 1979 as a writer and producer, going
on to become the first President of the
Women's Party of Australia, and the U.S. Women's
Party. She has also been a member of the Movie
Directors Guild of Australia and the Australian
Television Directors Association.

David Lean began his career in the film industry
in 1935 as a cameraman for the British Film Institute.
He later became a director, most notably for the
1946 film 'The Way We Live Now'. He was
awarded an Academy Award for Best Director
for his work on 'The Bridge on the River Kwai'
(1957) and 'Lawrence of Arabia' (1962).
